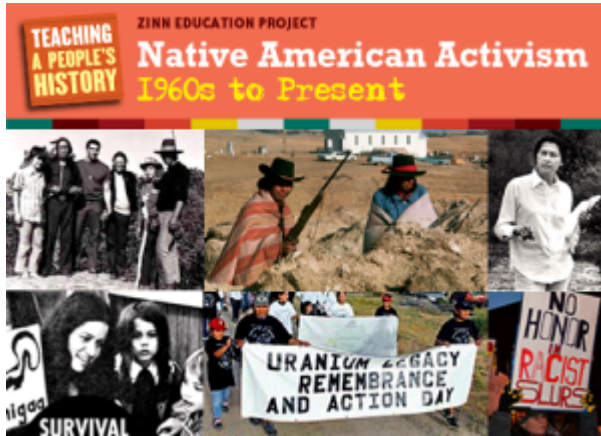


Native American Activism: 1960s To Today
